Guidance for Bespoke Cutting & Tailoring (Scotland)

The additional guidance below relates to the range of patterns / garments to be produced as evidence for the Bespoke Cutting and Tailoring (SCQF Level 6) qualification below.

Bespoke Cutter

To produce a minimum of 3 patterns:

- 1 Trouser or Skirt;
- 1 Waistcoat;
- 1 Coat/Jacket.

Bespoke Tailor (*handcraft/ bespoke trousers or skirt and waistcoat sub-group*)

To produce a minimum of 2 garments:

- 1 Trouser or Skirt;
- 1 Waistcoat.

Bespoke Tailor (*handcraft/ bespoke coat sub-group*)

To produce a minimum of:

- 2 Coats/Jackets.
